Awarded by Perennial Plant Association





Woody Ornamental Plants

Our broad range of woody ornamentals includes trees, shrubs and vines which are proven to be successful for multiple applications in the Northeast. We grow many native selections which offer beauty as well as improved habitat benefits to the landscape.

Acer tataricum Hot Wings®

Ornamental small tree or large shrub with spectacular red, orange and yellow fall color. Small yellow flowers in early May give way to clusters of bright red samaras in August. Tolerant of alkaline soils. (PP15023)

Zone: 4 H: 16' S: 16'



Amelanchier canadensis 'Rainbow Pillar'

Tall, upright deciduous shrub or small tree with fragrant white flowers from April to May, followed by blackish purple fruits in June. Low maintenance and highly adaptable to various soil conditions. (PP9092)

Zone: 4 H: 18' S: 8'

Hydrangea macrophylla Endless Summer® Pop Star™

Chamaecyparis nootkatensis 'Green Arrow'

Whimsically distinctive evergreen tree sporting an upright stature and open form with drooping, wizard's-sleeve-like branches, perfect as a vertical accent to the specimen garden. North American native.

Zone: 4 H: 25' S: 5'



Clematis montana var. grandiflora

Large, deciduous climbing vine occasionally reaching up to 40' in length, featuring fragrant, pure white blooms with yellow stamens that profusely cover the verdant green, deeply serrate foliage from May to June. Blooms appear sporadically into July, followed by fluffy seedheads. Great for vertical planting with trellises, pergolas, or fences. Tolerant of partial shade, rabbit and deer resistant.

Zone: 6 H: 25'



Clematis virginiana

Deciduous vine with small, fragrant white flowers from August to October that attract hummingbirds and other pollinators. Great for trellises or for growing up vertical supports or can be used as a groundcover.

Zone: 3 H: 16'



Cornus sericea Arctic Fire® 'Yellow'

North American native shrub with compact, dense branching that remains bright yellow to yellow green throughout autumn and winter. Small white flowers are visited by pollinators in May and June, replaced by glaucous white, berry-like fruits in summer that birds enjoy. Deer resistant and shade tolerant. (PP32351)

Zone: 3 H: 5' S: 6'



Hydrangea macrophylla Endless Summer® Pop Star™

Early blooming, densely compact shrub bred and selected by Bailey Nurseries for outstanding garden performance and full rebloom of profuse blue-to-pink lace-cap flowerheads. Adaptable to many landscape situations. (PP33703)

Zone: 4 H: 2' S: 2'



Malus x Royal Raindrops®

Highly disease resistant and ornamental throughout multiple seasons. Bright reddish pink flowers bloom in April and May give way to small edible crabapples in August and September, which can be harvested from mid-fall into winter and are often eaten by birds. Attractive orange-red fall color starting in October. Air pollution tolerant, and drought tolerant once established. (PP14375)

Zone: 4 H: 20' S: 15'



Grower's Comments

More information leads to better decisions. Our on-line and office availability are regularly updated with Grower's Comments by our Inventory Coordinator about plant conditions. The legend below is a guide for some of the keys now appearing on the availability.

Key	Description
B&B	Bud & Bloom.
Fall color/Fall foliage	Plant is exhibiting optimal fall color change on foliage.
Full Bloom	Full Bloom.
Gorgeous!	Absolutely stunning, either beautiful blooms, buds, fascinating seedheads or fruits paired with wonderful foliage, or even just lovely and colorful foliage of top quality on its own.
Light tops	Well-established roots, but small heads, or "tops" of plants. Usually a young or newer crop.
Light branching	Short or sparse branching of plant.
Landscape Grade	Not Retail Ready, but perfectly viable for use in a landscape.
Past Bloom	May still have some flowers but past full bloom.
Leggy	May look a bit stretched, but still has foliage on new shoots.
Reflushing	Was trimmed recently and is actively pushing new growth.
Retail Ready	Full foliage, buds/blooms and all around nice looking.
Seasonal look/foliage	Not a specimen - a bit past prime, fallen to the elements usually mid-summer (tipburn, discoloring, etc).
Seedheads	Typically grasses or other crops with showy seedheads.
Summer Dormancy	Plant may not have attractive growth/foliage, but roots are still viable.
Trimmed	A crop that has been visibly trimmed, has not reflushed yet.
Variable	A crop that has both light tops and tops that are fuller, denser, more retail ready.

Malus x Sugar Tyme®

Attractive throughout multiple seasons with glossy, dark green foliage on an oval, upright form. Delicate, lightly fragrant, white flowers emerge from light pink buds in April and May, becoming attractive bright red fruits in September and October which contrast beautifully against golden yellow fall foliage. Drought tolerant once established.

Zone: 4 H: 16' S: 12'



Rhododendron maximum

North American native broadleaf evergreen shrub with a loose, multi-stemmed habit known for forming dense thickets in its natural woodland habitat. Purplish pink summer blooms appear from June to July and are replaced by brown, persistent seed capsules in late fall. Tolerant of partial to full shade. Rabbit resistant.

Zone: 3 H: 10' S: 8'



Rosa palustris

Fragrant, light pink flowers that are attractive to pollinators appear from early June into July, followed by bright red rose hips in late summer and autumn that are enjoyed by birds. Great for handling wet sites, and tolerant of standing water.

Zone: 4 H: 4' S: 4'



Salix alba 'Tristis'

A large, deciduous tree with elegantly weeping branches and a fast-growing habit. Narrow, golden-colored foliage with whitish undersides rustles delicately in summer breezes, leaving behind graceful, weeping golden branches in late autumn and winter following leaf fall. Highly tolerant of moist soil conditions and resistant to deer.

Zone: 4 H: 60' S: 60'



Weigela florida Midnight Sun™


A rainbow of color throughout the summer and fall from the bronzy red, orange and green foliage to the hot pink tubular blooms that first appear in abundance during mid-May and then sporadically throughout the rest of the growing season. This compact deciduous shrub attracts hummingbirds and butterflies throughout its bloom period and tends to deter deer. (PP35146)

Pollinator Friendly Plants

Working in Horticulture, it's our responsibility and privilege to create beautiful and ecologically beneficial landscapes. All gardens can play a critical role in conserving pollinators. Much research has already been done to help make our job easier. Penn State College of Agricultural Sciences – Department of Entomology conducted a study in from 2012-2015 to evaluate native plant species and their cultivars for their attractiveness to pollinators and their suitability for homeowner and agricultural use.

The top 10 Plants for Total Pollinator Visits over 3 Years were identified and we currently grow 9 of them:

• <i>Pycnanthemum muticum</i>	• <i>Solidago rigida</i>	• <i>Eryngium yuccifolium</i>
• <i>Eupatorium hyssopifolium</i>	• <i>Liatris microcephala</i>	• <i>Eupatorium dubium</i>
• <i>Asclepias incarnata</i>	• <i>Monarda fistulosa</i>	• <i>Aster laevis</i> 'Bluebird'

Pollinators are attracted to native and non-native plants. Having a diverse landscape with pollinator friendly plants throughout the season is crucial to improving pollinator health. Include plants of different heights, flower count, shape and color to attract a broader selection of pollinators including bees, butterflies, flies, hummingbirds, moths, etc. Grouping plant varieties together will increase the nectar/pollen amount available per visit. Plants with numerous small flowers like *Aster lateriflorus* 'Lady in Black', *Calamintha nepeta* ssp. *nepeta*, *Phlox paniculata* 'Jeana' are especially attractive to pollinators.



Deer Resistant Plants

Deer resistance varies greatly from location to location, and what might be untouched in one site may be devoured in another. The lead doe in each herd eventually determines which plants are most palatable to her, and the herd faithfully follows her lead. As a result, “Deer Resistant” never means “Deer Proof”, as any number of us have found to our regret. Plants that have sap or fragrant foliage are often less likely to be eaten by deer. Buck rub is also a serious problem, and often Deer Resistant plants are susceptible to buck rub.

THE 2024 PERENNIAL PLANT OF THE YEAR® PHLOX PANICULATA ‘JEANA’



Phlox paniculata ‘Jeana’

‘Jeana’ is an exceptional garden phlox renowned for its impressive flower show, tall sturdy habit, and pollinator-friendliness. Dense, domed trusses crown stiff stems from midsummer to early fall. Individually, the fragrant lavender-pink flowers are significantly smaller than typical garden phlox – only about half an inch wide – but the show at peak is eye-popping, nonetheless. This is a case where bigger is not better, from a pollinator’s perspective anyhow. In trials at Mt. Cuba Center in Delaware, the nectar-rich flowers of ‘Jeana’ attracted more butterflies – Eastern Tiger Swallowtails were especially plentiful – than any other garden phlox in their study. Hummingbirds and other pollinators are fans too.

Topped with flowers, ‘Jeana’ can reach five feet tall and four feet wide, although size will vary geographically. Its bright green leaves are highly resistant to powdery mildew, so ‘Jeana’ has a striking summer look with or without flowers.

Herbaceous Plants

We grow a broad selection of herbaceous plants, covering perennials, grasses and ferns. They include options to beautify the landscapes from spring through winter. We offer many species and cultivars which serve as a critical food and habitat source for pollinators, birds and mammals. No garden is complete without herbaceous plants.

Aconitum fischeri

Spikes of deep azure blooms appear from August to October. Great for deterring rabbits, deer, and slugs due to highly toxic sap.

Zone: 4 H: 24" S: 12"



Andropogon glomeratus

Warm season grass with silvery pink, fluffy, brush-like inflorescences and following seedheads starting in September and persisting through much of winter into February or March. Strappy blue-green leaf blades turn a nice bronzy-orange in autumn and remain colorful into the winter. Showy seedheads are good for dried or fresh arrangements. Prefers moist to wet soil conditions. Tolerant of black walnut and air pollution.

Zone: 5 H: 60" S: 30"

Anemone canadensis

A lovely North American native perennial known for producing a prolific bloom of bright white, five-petaled flowers with golden yellow stamens from April to June, often reblooming sporadically throughout the summer. Attractive basal clumps of deeply lobed, medium green foliage can spread rapidly by rhizome in the landscape. Tolerant of partial shade and resistant to deer.

Zone: 3 H: 14" S: 12"



Anemone x 'Dainty Swan'

Attractive bicolored white and pink flowers rise above clumping green foliage from June to October. Prefers moist soil and full or dappled sun conditions. (PP29429)

Zone: 5 H: 24" S: 24"



Antennaria plantaginifolia

Clusters of inconspicuous, fluffy white flowerheads with flecks of pink appear above woolly silver-gray foliage from April to June. Great for poor, rocky and sandy soils in full sun conditions.

Zone: 3 H: 6" S: 12"



Aster novi-belgii

Light pink to lavender purple daisy-like blooms dominate the autumn landscape at a height of 3-5' from September to October. While this native perennial has no problem attracting a variety of pollinators to its flowers and songbirds to its seedheads, it tends to keep deer and rabbits at bay. Prefers well drained conditions, but is capable of handling nutrient-poor and somewhat moist soils.

Zone: 4 H: 36" S: 36"



Astilbe chinensis

'Dark Side of the Moon'

Low maintenance shade-tolerant perennial with rich, dark chocolate colored foliage throughout the growing season that emerges as a golden yellow with a marginal maroon tint. Upright plumes of burgundy-to-raspberry pink flowerheads appear later than early spring-blooming astilbes, typically between July and August. Capable of blooming even in full shade conditions. Requires consistently moist soils to prevent roots from drying out. (PPAF).

Zone: 4 H: 20" S: 24"



Begonia grandis

Showy, pendulous clusters of fragrant pink flowers appear from July to October, adding color to woodland sites and gardens with deep shade and rich, organic soil.

Zone: 6 H: 24" S: 24"



Carex vulpinoidea

A finely textured, wet-soil-tolerant native sedge perfect for creating a rapidly spreading groundcover matrix in the landscape. Great for streams, ponds, bioremediation projects, and naturalized wetlands.

Zone: 3 H: 36" S: 36"



Echinacea simulata

Dalea purpurea

One of the coolest flowers on the farm! This North American prairie native intrigues with upright magenta-purple flowers emerging from a central cylinder of blue-grey buds atop stiff, wiry stems and dainty pinnate foliage. Flowers are great for attracting all of the pollinators, while leftover seeds and foliage are an excellent source of protein for foraging mammals and birds.

Zone: 3 H: 26" S: 16"



Echinacea simulata

A North American prairie native that is rare in its natural habitat, this perennial wildflower boasts light to dark pink drooping outer rays with chestnut brown spherical centers beginning in early June and continuing into July and August. Tolerant of drought and other adverse soil conditions. Commonly used in roadside and utility plantings.

Zone: 5 H: 30" S: 18"



Epimedium x 'Rigoletto'

Sprays of tiny, ethereal flowers resembling spidery red and yellow jester's hats appear from late April to mid-June over top of airy looking cordate foliage. A wonderful collector's plant that spreads gracefully to form a nice shade-tolerant groundcover. Deer and rabbit resistant.

Zone: 5 H: 14" S: 18"



Equisetum hyemale

Prehistoric vascular species known for thriving in wet sites, where it proliferates by spore reproduction and swift underground rhizomes. Evergreen aerial parts resembling multi-segmented, leafless stems provide vertical interest to the landscape year-round. Highly tolerant of heavy shade as well as standing water.

Gladiolus dalenii 'Boone'

Beautiful, summery peach-apricot-yellow blooms throughout July on upright stalks that do not require staking. Cold hardy perennial, deer resistant.

Zone: 6 H: 36" S: 12"



Helianthus salicifolius 'Autumn Gold'

Long-lasting, bright golden yellow flowers appear continuously from August to November, standing consistently upright over thin, willow-like foliage and creating quite a show in the autumn landscape without the need for staking. Dense blooms make a great fresh cut flower. Tends to be deer resistant. (PP30117)

Iris x ampliflora 'Ming Treasure'

A brand new addition to the hybrid iris market, ready to pack a punch in the landscape with its 5' flower stalks. Soft blue-violet blooms with white and yellow interior markings begin appearing en masse in April and last until late May/early June. Performs best in light shade.

Juncus tenuis

An easily spreading, inconspicuous groundcover that is perfect for wet and disturbed areas. Great for restoration projects or naturalized areas where it can reseed freely.

Monarda bradburiana 'Midnight Oil'

Glossy, deep burgundy foliage contrast against light pink blooms with magenta splotches from May to June, attracting butterflies and hummingbirds. Ornamental seedheads persist into winter. Tolerant of black walnut, drought, heat, and light shade conditions. (PPAF)

Zone: 4 H: 20" S: 20"



Onoclea sensibilis

Eastern North American native fern with broad, deeply lobed, bright green, deciduous vegetative fronds on long stipes throughout the spring, summer and early fall months. Ornamentally interesting, brown fertile fronds persist throughout the winter into the following growing season. Prefers moist, woodland soil conditions to prevent rhizomes from drying out.

Gladiolus dalenii 'Boone'

Packera obovata

An incredibly underappreciated perennial native wildflower known for its early April bloom time, appearing often in slightly disturbed, woodland habitats with partial sun and dry to mesic soils. An important source of nectar for early emerging spring pollinators. Makes a good deer-resistant lawn replacement or groundcover where it will happily naturalize. Drought and heavy shade tolerant.

Zone: 3 H: 12" S: 8"

**Penstemon calycosus**

Upright, pink-mauve, snapdragon-like flowers emerge from June to July over glossy semi-evergreen foliage. Native to woodlands and mesic regions in Eastern North America. Unpalatable to deer.

Zone: 5 H: 30" S: 18"

**Phlox divaricata 'Blue Ribbons'**

Creamy white and soft green variegated foliage with pink margins stays evergreen and attractive throughout the year, taking on more elaborate pink and red hues in cooler weather. Upright clusters of five-petaled periwinkle-colored flowers with a lovely fragrance arrive in May, occasionally reblooming in the early to mid-fall with the red-tinted foliage contrasting beautifully against the purple blooms. Tolerant of partial shade conditions. (PP34928).

Phlox divaricata 'Blue Ribbons'

Phlox paniculata Luminary® 'Backlight'

Upright panicles of brilliant white flowers make a showy display from July to September over top of dark green foliage. Tolerant of high heat, humidity. Powdery mildew resistant. (PP34506)

Rudbeckia laciniata 'Autumn Sun'

Rodgersia pinnata 'Bronze Peacock'

Large, glossy, palmate foliage emerges bronze purple and becomes dark green with a bronze edge in summer, with tall, upright clusters of small pink flowers appearing between June and August. (PP24780)

Zone: 5 H: 18" S: 26"

**Rudbeckia laciniata 'Autumn Sun'**

Bright, sunshine yellow blooms appear from July to September, attracting a host of pollinators and towering over other perennials with an ultimate height of 7' throughout its blooming period.

**Salvia pratensis FASHIONISTA® 'Moulin Rouge'**

Fragrant, rose pink to fuchsia blooms appear in mid-May and last until early July, attracting various pollinators and making an excellent cut flower. Drought and heat tolerant; deer and rabbit resistant. (PP32387)

Zone: 3 H: 24" S: 28"

**Sanguisorba officinalis**

Small but attractive, dark burgundy to dark purple blooms appear on upright spikes over medium green foliage from May to July. Edible flowers and foliage. Deer tolerant.

Zone: 4 H: 30" S: 26"

**Silene caroliniana**

Clusters of hot pink, phlox-like flowers appear from May into June over narrow, medium green foliage that remains semi-evergreen in mild winter climates. Native to Eastern United States. Drought and dry soil tolerant.

Zone: 5 H: 6" S: 6"

**Solidago caesia**

Native perennial with arching stems and golden yellow flowers from September into October followed by seedheads that are an important food source for songbirds. Shade and drought tolerant. Tends to deter deer and rabbits.

Zone: 4 H: 24" S: 24"

**Sorghastrum nutans Golden Sunset®**

Native, vigorously clumping, warm season grass with spectacular, golden yellow inflorescences appearing in August over strappy, olive-green leaf blades. A selection of the 2005 University of Minnesota trials for its early bloom time, consistently upright stature, and outstanding landscape performance. Seedheads evolve to a golden-bronze, remaining vertical without flopping well into the winter. (PP33776)

Zone: 3 H: 60" S: 36"

**Stachys minima**

From June to July, rose-purple flowers appear above the miniature stature of crinkled, deep green foliage. Attractive to butterflies. Deer and rabbit resistant.

Zone: 4 H: 4" S: 8"


**Veronica peduncularis 'Whitewater'**

Showy, small white flowers appear between April to June, blooming sporadically throughout the summer over a burgundy-green carpet of foliage. Tolerates light foot traffic, drought, humidity, deer, and rabbits. (PP22783)

Pleasant Run Nursery is a WHOLESALE nursery to the trade. First orders at Pleasant Run Nursery are COD. The minimum order for pickup is \$500.00.

Minimum Order Quantities

There is a six (6) plant minimum per individual item for Quart, 1 and 2 gallon material, and a four (4) plant minimum per individual item for 3 gallon material. There is no minimum for 5 gallon+.

When ordering less than the minimum, please add:

\$1.00 per plant for Quart, 1 and 2 gallon material

\$2.00 per plant for 3 gallon material

Terms

Cash, Check, MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover until credit is established. Credit accounts are payable Net 30 days. 1.5% per month finance charge on all past due balances. Failure to pay finance charge can result in loss of credit. There is a 3% surcharge on credit cards. A \$25 fee will be charged for any returned checks.

Claims

We guarantee that our plants are healthy and true to name upon leaving our nursery. All claims for losses are to be made within 10 days of delivery or pick up. Claims for damages or shortages must be made within 48 hours. All claims for non-viability in plants which are dormant must be made as soon as the plants can be determined to be non-viable. We will gladly correct any mistakes made by us. We do NOT accept returns unless it is a result of our error. In no case will our liability exceed the amount of purchase. The purchaser is always liable for freight charges.

Prices

All prices are F.O.B. Pleasant Run Nursery, Inc. Prices are subject to change without notice. These are wholesale prices only.

Sales Tax

We are required to collect 6.625% sales tax on all orders picked up or delivered within New Jersey, unless a properly executed New Jersey sales tax exempt certificate is received. Deliveries to out of state customers are exempt. Once sales tax is invoiced it is payable to the State and will not be refunded. Sales to landscape contractors are not tax exempt in New Jersey.

Sizing of Plants

Sizes noted are for approximate mature sizes in average landscape conditions. Growth will vary according to site, temperature, soil, and moisture conditions. In determining plant sizes on our nursery, we follow the "American Standard for Nursery Stock" published by the ANLA.

Hardiness Zone

The zones in our catalog are based on research performed and published by the USDA, resulting in their "USDA Hardiness Zone Map". We list the zones for the coldest temperature which the specific plant will tolerate in normal Northeastern winter conditions.

Cancellations/Postponements


We ask that you be sure of your pick up or delivery date before asking us to pull your order. Material canceled by the customer after the order has been acknowledged and pulled may be subject to a 10% restocking fee. If your order has been pulled and your job date is then delayed for 2 or more days, there may be a handling fee.

Deliveries
