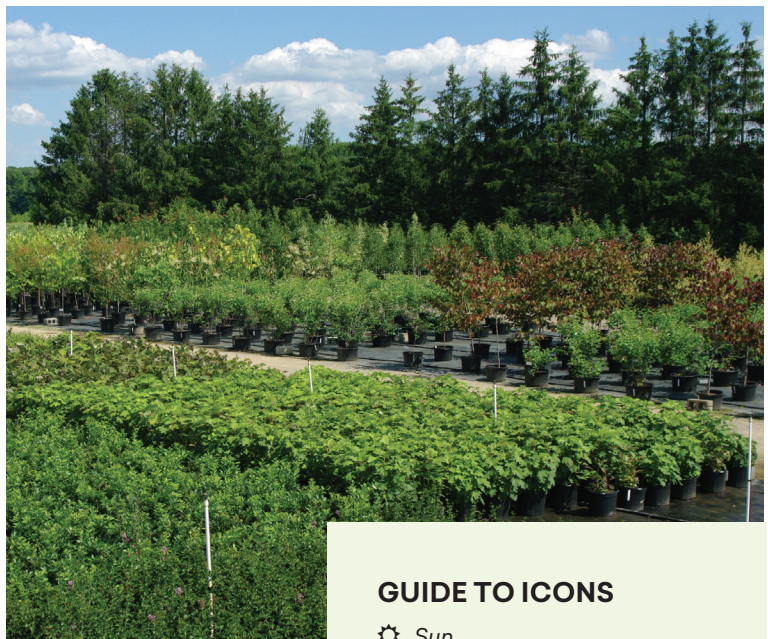
Greetings from Pleasant Run Nursery

Woody Ornamental Plants

Our broad range of woody ornamentals included trees, shrubs and vines which are proven to be successful for multiple applications in the Northeast. We grow many native selections which offer beauty as well as improved habitat benefits to the landscape.

Acer saccharum 'Green Mountain'

Inconspicuous greenish yellow flowers appear in April before the leathery dark green leaves emerge. The oval shape is beautiful, as is the yellow to orange fall color. (PP2339)

Bignonia capreolata 'Dragon Lady'

Salmon red trumpet-shaped flowers on a background of neat leaves in early to mid summer. Foliage turns bronzy purple in fall and is semi-evergreen.

Zone: 4 H: 20'



Buxus NewGen™ Freedom®

Glossy bright green evergreen leaves on a rapid growing plant. Benefits from yearly trimming especially for hedging. Resistant to Boxwood Blight and Leafminer.

Zone: 5 H: 4' S: 4'

Buxus NewGen™ Independence®

Deep green lustrous evergreen leaves on a rounded slow-growing habit. Performs best in partial shade and is Boxwood Blight and Leafminer resistant. (PP28888)

Zone: 6 H: 3' S: 3'



Celtis occidentalis Prairie Sentinel™

Coarse green disease resistant foliage on a tightly columnar habit make Prairie Sentinel™ an excellent street tree for multiple urban conditions.

Zone: 3 H: 45' S: 12'



Cercis canadensis Flame Thrower®

Pink pea-shaped flowers on bare stems in April are followed by leaves changing from reddish burgundy in May to yellow and green as they mature. (PP31260)

Zone: 5 H: 20' S: 15'



Cornus florida 'Cloud 9'

Large showy flowers formed by flat white bracts in April and May, followed by green leaves which turn shades of red in fall. Shiny red fruit is food for birds. (PP2112)

Zone: 5 H: 20' S: 20'

Cercis canadensis Flame Thrower®

Cornus mas 'Spring Glory'

Bunches of bright yellow small flowers on bare branches in March, followed by leathery green foliage. Provides much needed color in early spring.

Zone: 5 H: 20' S: 15'



Gymnocladus dioicus Espresso™

Inconspicuous white fragrant flowers over large green pinnate leaves in late May. 'Espresso' is a male form so there are no large cumbersome seedpods. Tolerant of a wide range of conditions.

Zone: 3 H: 50' S: 35'

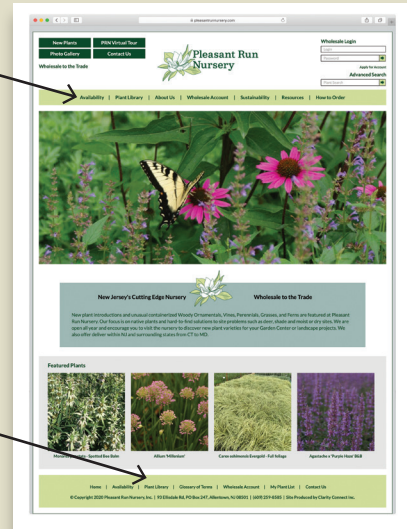

Hamamelis vernalis 'Kohankie Red'

Reddish purple flowers appear in January through March. The green leaves turn to yellow, orange and red in fall. On its own roots.

Zone: 4 H: 8' S: 10'



Hamamelis virginiana 'Winter Champagne'

Fragrant light orange ribbon flowers appear on bare branches from December through January. Green summer foliage turns yellow in fall.

Zone: 3 H: 12' S: 12'



Hydrangea macrophylla Let's Dance® Blue Jangles™

Deep blue (or pink) mopheads on a compact green plant reblooming from early summer to fall. Color is determined by pH. (PP27035)

Zone: 5 H: 3' S: 3'



Hydrangea paniculata Fire Light™

Creamy white panicles over green foliage in late June. Flowers turn more red as summer days get shorter. Compact habit. (PP25135)

Zone: 3 H: 4' S: 3'



Prunus laurocerasus 'Chestnut Hill'

Fragrant white flower spikes above dark green evergreen leaves in late spring. Compact, salt and shade tolerant. (PP24800)

Zone: 6 H: 4' S: 5'



Rhododendron Encore® Autumn Amethyst®

2" rosy purple flowers above dark green evergreen foliage in both late spring and early fall. Winter foliage takes on shades of burgundy and purple.

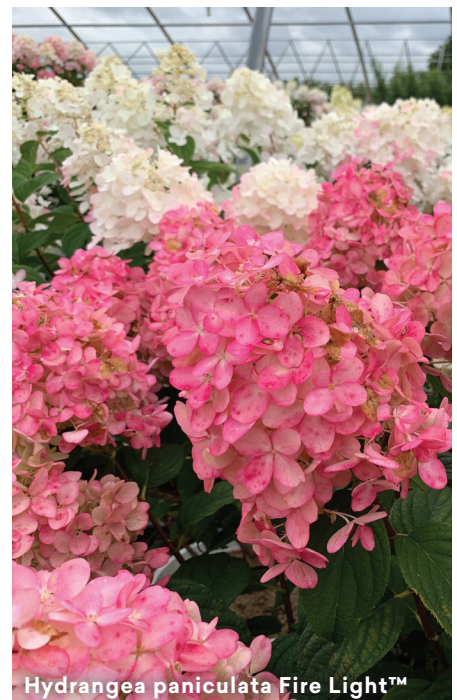

Rosa rugosa 'Foxi Pavement'

Lavender pink fragrant flowers over green disease resistant leaves, produced throughout the summer. A groundcover rose with good fall color and large red rose hips.

Zone: 3 H: 3' S: 5'



Hydrangea paniculata Fire Light™

**Rosa rugosa 'Purple Pavement'**

Semi-double reddish purple flowers above low growing green foliage through much of the summer. Very fragrant, good groundcover.

Zone: 3 H: 3' S: 4'

**Symphoricarpos Magical® 'Mandy'**

Delicate pink flowers in June over neat light green foliage, maturing to pearl pink large berries in early fall. Good addition to cut flower arrangements. Makes a showy fall hedge.

Zone: 3 H: 4' S: 3'

**Weigela florida Spilled Wine®**

Dark pink funnel-shaped flowers cover the deep purple foliage in mid spring. Wide and short in habit, so a good low maintenance foundation plant option. (PP23781)

The tables below will be a helpful guide to plants for various landscape applications.

We have listed a few options for each area, but there are many more plants to be found on our website for these situations. In order to save space, we have listed the plants primarily by Genus unless there is a specific cultivar we suggest.

Deer Resistant Plants

Deer resistance varies greatly from location to location, and what some of us find to be untouched in one site may be devoured in another. The lead doe in each herd eventually determines which plants are most palatable to her, and the herd faithfully follows her lead. As a result, "Deer Resistant" never means "Deer Proof", as a number of you found to your regret. Buck rub is also a serious problem, and often Deer Resistant plants are susceptible to buck rub. We have listed just a few of the particularly resistant options we grow:

Trees in Containers

There are a number of great trees which show poor survival rates when dug in the fall, so the season for digging them successfully is very short. There are also a number of trees which may be in short supply in B+B at various times of the year.

As a result, we are expanding our selection of container grown trees to include trees which are important and beautiful additions to the landscape. Since container trees are planted without having their roots severed, they usually catch up quickly with larger B+B trees.

We have also seen an increased interest in plants for tight spaces as people move to smaller yards. There are a number of trees that have an upright growth habit without sacrificing beauty and function. They offer beauty in multiple seasons, making gardens rewarding even if the space is small.

Herbaceous Plants

We grow a broad selection of herbaceous plants, covering perennials, grasses and ferns. They include options to beautify the landscapes from spring through winter. We offer many species and cultivars which serve as critical food and habitat source for pollinators, birds and mammals. No garden is complete without herbaceous plants.

Achillea millefolium 'Sassy Summer Sangria'

Deep red flat flower clumps held on sturdy stems above green fern-like foliage. Blooms most of the summer if deadheaded. (PP31355)

Zone: 3 H: 36" S: 40"



Allium 'Medusa'

Light purple drumstick flowers appear above gray-green twisty strap-like leaves in late summer and early fall. Deer proof! (PP28701)

Zone: 4 H: 22" S: 24"



Allium senescens 'Blue Eddy'

Pinkish lavender round flowers in August above blue gray swirly strap-like foliage. Resistant to deer, attractive to pollinators.

Zone: 4 H: 12" S: 12"



Andropogon ternarius 'Black Mountain'

Silver inflorescences on reddish stems in fall follow the blue green summer foliage. Very tolerant of poor soils and dry sites.

Zone: 6 H: 36" S: 18"



Aster cordifolius 'Avondale'

Lots of small light blue daisy-like flowers over fine green foliage in August and September. Tolerates shade well and is not attractive to deer.

Zone: 3 H: 36" S: 24"



Baptisia x Decadence® Deluxe 'Pink Lemonade'

Soft yellow buds mature to raspberry pink over green foliage and charcoal stems. Blooms from late spring to mid summer, with round gray seed capsules in fall.

Zone: 4 H: 48" S: 48"



Achillea millefolium 'Sassy Summer Sangria'



Aster cordifolius 'Avondale'

Carex morrowii EverColor® 'Everglow'

Graceful refined blades are striped with green, ivory and soft orange. Clump forming and evergreen. (PP30466)

Zone: 6 H: 18" S: 18"



Chelone glabra 'Black Ace'

Clumps of white snapdragon-like flowers in August to October over ebony green foliage. Loves really wet sites. For shorter flower spikes, pinch back somewhat in June.

Zone: 5 H: 36" S: 24"



Coreopsis tripteris 'Gold Standard'

Bright yellow daisy-like flowers with dark center cones are displayed on disease resistant green foliage. Stems are 5' but sturdy, and summer bloom period is very long.

Zone: 3 H: 62" S: 24"



**Echinacea purpurea
Kismet® 'Red'**

Bright red daisy-like coneflowers are held on dark bronze stems over green foliage starting in mid summer. Blooms for a long time, and makes a showy cut flower. (PP29743)

Zone: 4 H: 20" S: 18"



**Epimedium ssp. nova
'Spine Tinger'**

Delicate pale yellow flowers hover over dark green toothed evergreen foliage in April and May. Slow but excellent groundcover for dry shade.

Zone: 5 H: 8" S: 24"



**Hemerocallis Rainbow
Rhythm® 'Ruby Spider'**

**Epimedium wushanense
'Sandy Claws'**

Delicate ivory yellow flowers held above chocolate spiny leaves in April and May. Spring leaf color changes to dark green in summer. Evergreen and very dry site tolerant in shade.

Zone: 6 H: 12" S: 24"



Geum x 'Totally Tangerine'

Many peachy orange flowers displayed on tall fuzzy sprays above green clumping foliage from late spring to mid summer. Good cut flower. (PP22041)

Zone: 5 H: 24" S: 18"



Hosta 'Cathedral Windows'

**Heliopsis helianthoides var.
scabra 'Burning Hearts'**

Large yellow daisy-like flowers with reddish centers and cones are displayed on tall green plants from early summer to fall. A food source for pollinators in summer and songbirds in fall.

Zone: 3 H: 48" S: 18"



**Hemerocallis Rainbow Rhythm®
'Ruby Spider'**

9" ruby red spatulate flowers with big yellow eye zones over green strap-like leaves bloom in mid summer. Tall and very showy, especially 'en masse'.

Zone: 3 H: 34" S: 24"



**Hibiscus x Summerific®
'Cranberry Crush'**

Large bright scarlet flowers appear along tall stems with green maple-like leaves throughout the summer. Ideal plant for rain gardens, bioswales and sunny streamsides. (PP21984)

Zone: 4 H: 48" S: 60"



Hosta 'Cathedral Windows'

White fragrant flowers above leaves with bright gold centers and wide dark green margins. Flowers appear in late summer. Tall scapes make good cut flowers. (PP17295)

Zone: 3 H: 22" S: 24"



Iris fulva

Flat copper orange flowers above green strap-like foliage in late spring. Extremely tolerant of wet sites.

Zone: 5 H: 30" S: 24"



Iris siberica 'Cape Cod Boys'

Periwinkle blue ruffled flowers over green strap-like leaves appear in late May and early June. Tolerant of both wet and dry soils, and deer resistant.

Zone: 3 H: 30" S: 24"



Iris siberica 'Sunfisher'

Bright yellow flowers over green strap-like foliage in May and early June. Deer resistant, wet site tolerant and a striking addition to rain gardens and pond edges.

Zone: 3 H: 28" S: 24"



Iris versicolor 'Purple Flame'

Violet blue flag flowers over eggplant purple blade-shaped leaves in late spring. Foliage transitions to green in summer. Extremely wet site tolerant.

Zone: 2 H: 36" S: 24"

Nepeta x 'Cat's Pajamas'

Numerous indigo blue flower spikes cover fragrant green mounded foliage for all summer if sheared periodically. Loved by pollinators, ignored by deer. (PP31127)

Panicum virgatum 'Thundercloud'

Airy pinkish tan inflorescences top upright blue green stems and blades starting in July. Panicums are excellent for winter interest in the landscape. (PP20665)

Pennisetum alopecuroides Lumen Gold™

Golden foliage in spring matures to chartreuse green in summer. Attractive seedheads appear in late summer and are showy throughout the fall. Don't cut back until spring.

Penstemon digitalis 'Onyx and Pearls'

Lavender and white tall flower clumps above very dark purple foliage in early to mid summer. Flowers are very showy on black stems, making excellent cut flowers. (PPAF)

Persicaria amplexicaulis 'Golden Arrow'

Rosy pink to red flower spikes are produced over gold foliage from July to early fall. Prefers partial shade and moist locations.

Rudbeckia x 'American Gold Rush'

Yellow daisy-like cone flowers start in July and are produced throughout the rest of the summer. Makes a large patch eventually and has clean disease resistant foliage. (PP28498)

Salvia nemorosa 'Bumbleberry'

Fuchsia pink spikes with dark purple calyxes over green aromatic foliage. Blooms in May and June. Much deeper color than other pink Salvias. (PP31602)

Sedum x 'Night Embers'

Mauve pink flower clusters are held above dark purple succulent foliage in fall. Needs full sun and dry conditions. (PP29211)

Zone: 3 H: 24" S: 20"



Vernonia x 'Southern Cross'

Multitudes of delicate purple flowers crown the fine green foliage in late summer and early fall. Excellent for pollinators but unattractive to deer.

Zone: 4 H: 48" S: 48"



Veronicastrum virginicum 'Cupid'

Tall spikes of lavender blue flowers on maroon stems with green lanceolate leaves. Blooms in late summer and early fall. Excellent food source for pollinators.

Zone: 4 H: 36" S: 20"

Terms

Cash, Check, MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover until credit is established. Credit accounts are payable Net 30 days. 1.5% per month finance charge on all past due balances. Failure to pay finance charge can result in loss of credit. A \$25 fee will be charged for any returned checks.

Claims

We guarantee that our plants are healthy and true to name upon leaving our nursery. All claims for losses are to be made within 10 days of delivery or pick up. Any damages or shortages must be made within 48 hours. All claims for non-viability in plants which are dormant must be made as soon as the plants can be determined to be non-viable. We will gladly correct any mistakes made by us. We do NOT accept returns unless it is a result of our error. In no case will our liability exceed the amount of purchase. The purchaser is always liable for freight charges.

Prices

All prices are F.O.B. Pleasant Run Nursery, Inc. Prices are subject to change without notice. These are wholesale prices only.

Sales Tax

We are required to collect 6.625% sales tax on all orders picked up or delivered within New Jersey, unless a properly executed sales tax exempt certificate is received. Deliveries to out of state customers are exempt. Sales to landscape contractors are not tax exempt in New Jersey.

Client Visits

Since we are a wholesale nursery, we ask that you do not bring or send your customers to the nursery without our permission. Please feel free to call us with any questions you may have about your plant tagging needs.

Sizing of Plants

Sizes noted are for approximate mature sizes in average landscape conditions. Growth will vary according to site

temperature, soil and moisture conditions. In determining plant sizes on our nursery, we follow the "American Standard for Nursery Stock" published by the ANLA.

Hardiness Zone

The zones in our catalog are based on research performed and published by the USDA, resulting in their "USDA Hardiness Zone Map". We list the zones for the coldest temperature which the specific plant will tolerate in normal Northeastern winter conditions.

Cancellations/Postponements

We ask that you be sure of your pick up or delivery date before asking us to pull your order. Material canceled by the customer after the order has been acknowledged and pulled may be subject to a 10% restocking fee. If your order has been pulled and your job date is then delayed for 2 or more days, there may be a handling fee.

Pre-Orders

Orders may be booked for 30-45 days in advance. Orders taken in advance for pick-up or delivery between 45 and 90 days must be accompanied by a 25% non-refundable deposit. If orders are not picked up or delivered after 90 days, they will be voided. If orders must be postponed after the spring date of June 1st or the fall date of November 15th, they will be canceled and can be rebooked the next season if desired.

Pick Ups

Pleasant Run Nursery is a WHOLESALE nursery to the trade. First orders of new customers at Pleasant Run Nursery are COD. The minimum order is \$250.00.

Deliveries

Minimum order amount for delivery is \$1,500. Our delivery rates are based on flat mileage. All orders for delivery must be finalized by noon, 1½ business days prior to the delivery date. Any additions received after this deadline cannot be guaranteed to make the delivery. Claims for damages or shortages must be made within 48 hours. Customer is responsible to meet the truck and offload plant material at the time which has been prearranged.
